- ▶ **Expert Witness Services (UK High Court):** assisted in the provision of expert services in relation to a claim brought by an oil and gas company against its former executives where it was alleged that the former executives had diverted profits from the company. This involved quantifying the diverted profits and identifying how the profits had been spent
- ▶ **Expert Witness Services (Arbitration):** assisted in the provision of expert services in relation to an alleged breach of contract claim. This involved quantifying the lost profits and loss of opportunity for assets in the renewable energy industry, alongside numerous industry experts
